

probably went to John, his son. According to tax records, a modest house value appeared in				
1846, but jumped to \$1200 in 1853. The farm stayed in Augspurger hands until 1898.

John Augspurger Farm #1 (#3)

Beginning at the junction of the drive and Woodsdale Road, proceed east along the the drive for 75 feet to Point B. Turn at a 90° angle and proceed north 100 feet to Point C. Then turn at a 90° angle and proceed west to Woodsdale Road, then at a 90° angle and proceed south along Woodsdale Road to Point A.





