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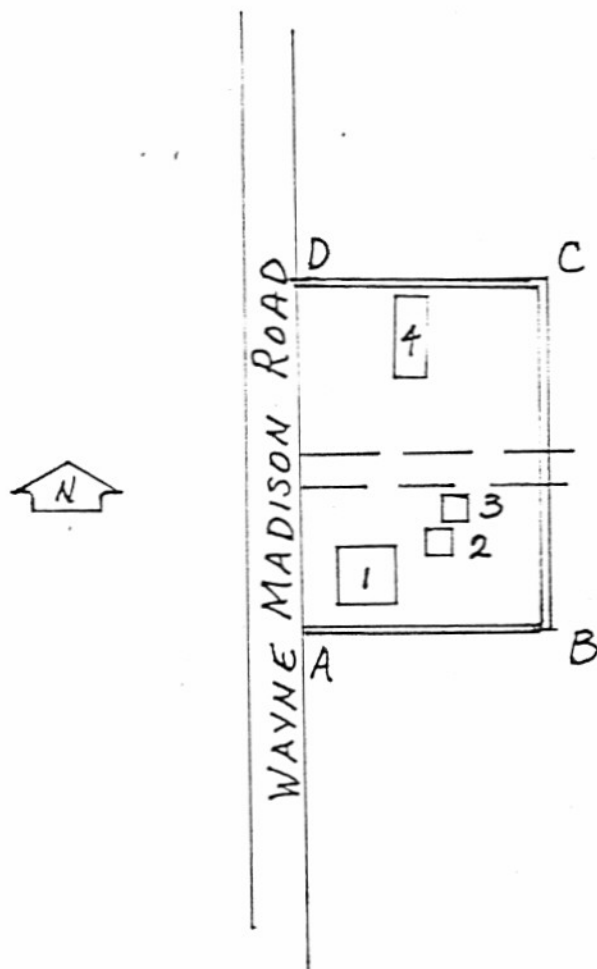

42. Further Description of Important Features The imposing house has three bays to the front with a central doorway that has transom and sidelights. To the north is a porch that shelters two doorways and attaches to a one-story kitchen area. The boxed cornice abounds with brackets. The 6/6 DHS have flat lintels and sills. There are three internal chimneys.			
43. History and Significance This house was built by Frederick Augspurger, Christian Augspurger's son. Frederick was a large stockholder in the Beckett Paper Company which was established in Woodsdale in 1867. This land was purchased by Christian Augspurger from John Holly (another Mennonite) in 1847. The land went from John Augspurger (Christian's son) to Frederick in 1849. By 1899 after Frederick had died, the farm was sold out of Mennonite hands.			
44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings There is a bank barn, smoke house and summer kitchen still standing. The farm is just a mile or so south of the Miller Brewing Company on the opposite side of the road.

Verbal Boundary Description and Acreage

Frederick Augspurger Farm (#8)

Beginning at the southwest corner of the yard on a fencerow denoted as Point A, proceed along the fencerow for 150 feet to Point B, then turn at a 90° angle and proceed north 200 feet to Point C. Turn at a 90° angle and proceed 150 feet to the Wayne-Madison Road, then proceed south along the road to Point A. Approximately one acre.



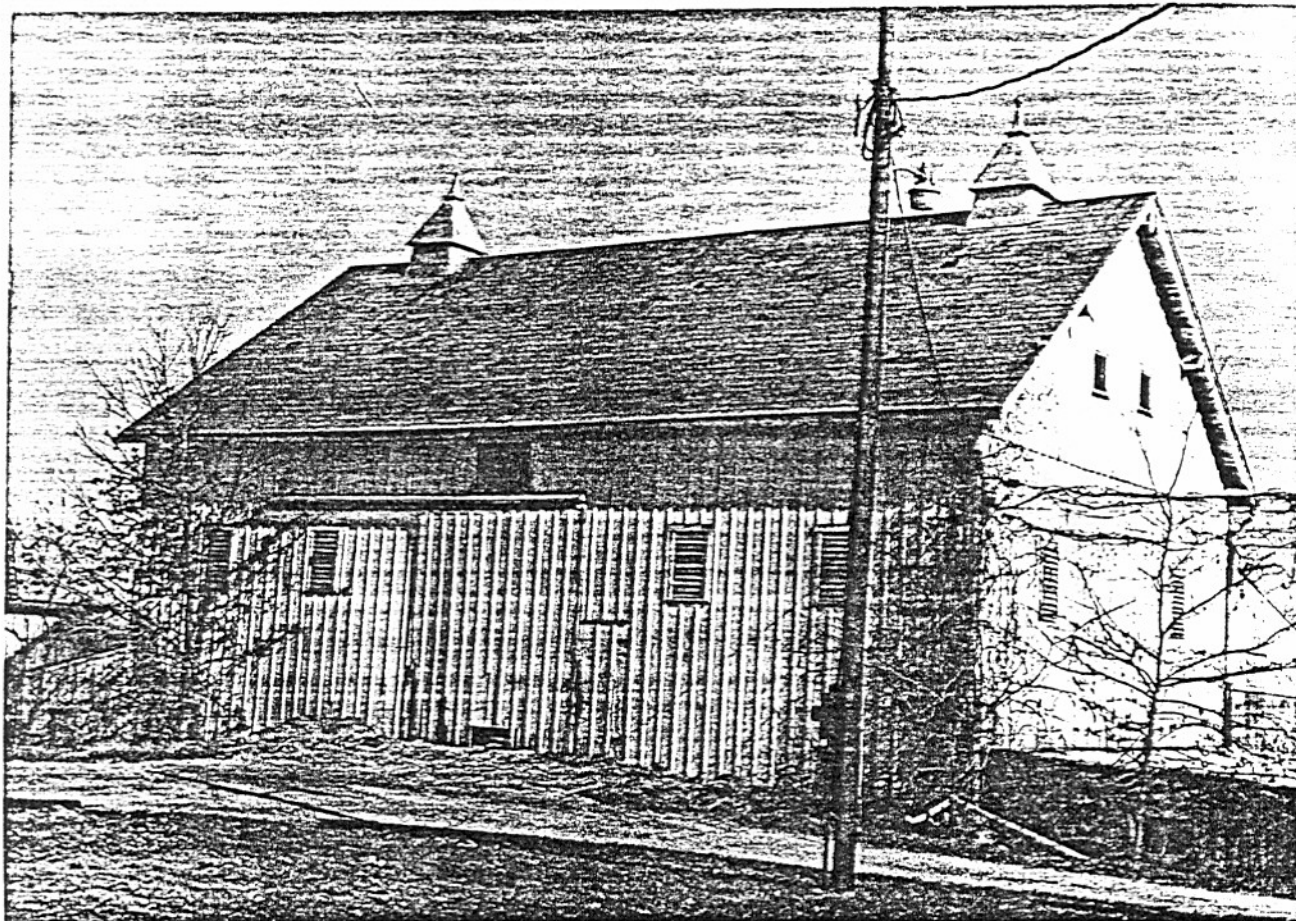
